More than 200 years ago, in 1818, a man named Joseph Mohr, who was a Catholic priest, was walking outside on a quiet winter's night. He lived in Austria in a time of unrest. And he was so happy that this night was peaceful, that he began to write a poem called, Stille Nacht. He wrote his poem in the German language. But we know it now as, Silent Night.

It was three years later, on a snowy Christmas Eve that Joseph Mohr walked to a neighbouring town where his friend, Franz Gruber lived. Franz was an organist, guitarist and composer. Father Joseph needed a hymn for his Christmas Eve service. He hoped that Franz could take the verses he wrote for Silent Night and put them to a melody. Franz did that for him. And they played the new song together that evening at Father Joseph's church service.

The song became a big hit! It is sung in many different languages. But it is best known around the world in English as, Silent Night.
